# Kerala may tweak law to allow civilians to kill wild animals

IN what could initiate fresh debate over mitigating the human-wildlife conflict, Law Minister P Rajeev said the state government, acting on legal advice, is considering to introduce an amendment to the Wildlife Protection Act 1972 to empower the chief wildlife warden to authorise any person to kill or capture a wild animal that causes serious injury to human beings or poses threat to a public place.

The minister announced the decision at a two-day regional conference on 'Human-Wildlife Conflict and Co-Existence: Legal and Policy Perspectives' or-Services Authority (NALSA) and the Kerala State Legal Services Authority (KeLSA) in Thiruvananthapuram on Saturday.

## In 7 months, GRH generates 45 tonnes of biomedical waste

THE Government Rajaji Hospital (GRH), Madurai, generated a total of 45.36 tonnes of biomedical waste in the past seven months (January-July 2025).

According to official records, the hospital generated 7.01 tonnes of waste in January, 6.05 tonnes in February, 7.196 tonnes in March, 6.40 tonnes in April, 6.21 tonnes in May, 5.96 tonnes in June and 6.49 tonnes in July.

Dr S Saravanan, resident medical officer (RMO), told *TNIE*, "We are So, we created a large room near the mortuary to store this waste. Besides, this waste is properly kept away from domestic waste and can typically of 48 hours. However, the stor-

rules and the kind of waste they are. So, storage locations are safe."

Explaining the forms of waste storage, a GRH staff member said that colours are used to define the kind of waste that is collected.

A staff nurse said, "Though the waste collection is handled by the housekeeping staff hired by an outsourced agency, we monitor the entire proc-

ess. Since proper segre-

gation is very crucial, waste is placed in colourcoded bags. While yellow colour bags are used to collect wastes like placenta, blood-stained clothes, discarded human tissues, red coloured bags are used for plastic waste such as urinal bags, intravenous fluid (IV) sets and syringes. Sharp objects such as injections are col-

THERE is precedence of invoking PCA in such cases. Investigating an identical scam in Salem Corporation, the Salem detachment of the Directorate of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption in January 2024 had filed a case under the PC Act against N Murugesan, assistant revenue officer, for intentionally under-assessing property taxes and other allegations and thereby causing a loss of ₹9.63 lakh to the state government.

Meanwhile, Arun Raj, who joined the Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) in June after quitting the Indian Revenue Service, in a post on X on Saturday, highlighted the matter and alleged that Sections 120B, 420, 471 of the IPC and the PC Act were "cleverly omitted" so that the ED does not enter the picture. "This has not been done to Plastic waste generated by protect lower-level employees; already many top leaders of DMK are under ED's investigation and the move is to prevent another probe against them," he said. Raj also urged CM MK Stalin and the Tamil Nadu DGP to invoke the sections and conduct a thorough probe to pun-

ish the real perpetrators. DIG Abhinav Kumar, who heads the SIT which is investigating the Madurai case, did not respond to queries seeking comment. (The police had invoked sections of IPC and not BNSS since the alleged crime occurred prior to BNSS coming into force on July 1, 2024).
